<b>Eucharistic Adoration</b>	
Description of Role	Engaging the power of prayer by watching the Blessed Sacrament for a period each week.
Time Required	One hour each week
Gifts & Talents	Commitment to prayer, and to supporting the parish in this way. Ability to be on your own for the period of adoration
Support Provided	No special training is needed and you will be supported by others during your periods of adoration.  Each person starting Adoration receives a copy of the rota and a list of standby Adorers, and a set of guidelines (how to repose the Blessed Sacrament if not relieved etc.)
