Childrens' Liturgy Liturgist	
Description of Role	To offer children the opportunity to hear the Gospel at a level and in a way they can understand .so that they can take the message into their daily lives. Role 1: The leader chooses, prepares and delivers the activity which stems from the gospel reading Role 2: The team member provides backup (administrative, helping with the activity and sometimes helping prepare materials)
Time Required	Once every 6 weeks, 1 hour preparation, 20 minutes at Mass.
Gifts & Talents	Willingness to share faith Ablity to relate to children, to be patient organised and kind. Ability to work as part of a team
Support Provided	Support is offered through occasional meetings and by teaming up with experienced Liturgy leader. Guidelines are shown on a webpage of the Portsmouth Diocesan website A selection of Children's Liturgy books are available, which provide ready-made activities Completion of a Disclosure and Barring (DBS) check is necessary in line with the Diocesan Safeguarding Policy
