Minister of Holy Communion	
Description of Role	Assist in the distribution of Holy Communion at Masses and/or take the Eucharist to the sick and housebound in the parish.
	Ministers going out, meet before Mass to confirm names of those to be visited. Instructions are available for ministry within the Mass.
	This ministry is open to any confirmed Catholic.
Time Required	By rota approximately once every 3/4 weeks during Mass and afterwards for up to 2 hours if visiting.
Gifts & Talents	A reverence for the Blessed Sacrament. The ability to be a good listener and to show tact and understanding in someone else's home.
Support Provided	Short training session required, plus visiting with experienced Special Minister. Occasional meetings. Completion of a Disclosure and Barring (DBS) check is necessary in line with the Diocesan Safeguarding Policy for those visiting outside Mass Pyx and purifiers are provided.
